Lisa Lambeth, Concealed 360's Founder and Principal, began her career as a Federal Probation Officer in the Northern District of Texas, Dallas, Texas, where she was the Intensive Supervision Specialist. She supervised high profile offenders including leaders of drug organizations, notorious white-collar offenders and those with ties to terrorist organizations. It was in this position that she developed the surveillance team and worked on numerous task force operations including the Domestic Terrorism Task Force, the Asian Gang Task Force and The Russian Organized Crime Task Force. She also served as an a firearms and safety instructor training her peers.

In 2006, Lisa began working as an instructor with the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) in Charleston, South Carolina. There, she conducted advanced firearms and safety training with federal law enforcement agencies including US Courts, Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), US Marshal's Witness Protection Program, the US Army's Combat Camera Program, the Coast Guard and the Taiwanese Navy. In 2008, she transferred to the Federal Probation and Pretrial Training Academy as a lead instructor. Lisa's primary focus was firearms, but she also taught officer response tactics (hand-to-hand combat), domestic violence, mental health supervision, sex offender supervision and testifying skills classes.

In 2008, Lisa developed a program for law enforcement officers who struggled to shoot with a focus on female shooters. The program was presented at various live fire venues throughout the U.S., including the 2009 Women In Federal Law Enforcement Conference (WIFLE). Lisa was the recipient of the 2009 WIFLE Executive Committee Award, which she dedicated to her team of instructors.

Lisa developed a program called "After Hours Safety" (Concealed 360 course- Concealing Your Identity) which teaches officers how to be physically and digitally anonymous. This program has been presented at various law enforcement conferences and continues as a staple class at the Federal Probation and Pretrial academy.

In 2012, Lisa co-authored an article entitled "The Fear Factor" that was published in the International Law Enforcement Educators and Trainers Association (ILEETA) journal. In 2018, Lisa retired after serving as the Acting Branch Chief of the Firearms and Safety Branch for the Federal Probation and Pretrial Academy, located at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) in Charleston, SC, and founded Concealed 360.
